SUBJECT: AMERICAN RECOVERY & REINVESTMENT ACT (ARRA) FORMULA ALLOCATIONS

The purpose of this Information Notice is to announce the release of the ARRA Workforce Investment Act (WIA) formula funds to each Local Workforce Investment Area (LWIA) for the Adult, Youth and Dislocated Worker (DW) funding streams. All funding provided is based on the allotments issued for ARRA by the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) to the states in Training and Employment Guidance Letter (TEGL) 13-08 dated March 6, 2009.

As in previous years, the allocations for the Adult and Youth funding streams were calculated using the "hold-harmless" factor. The DW funding also contains a "hold-harmless" factor as approved by the California Workforce Investment Board on November 30, 2006. This hold-harmless provision for DW helps mitigate the year-to-year volatility by ensuring each LWIA receives no less than 90 percent of their average DW percentage from the prior two years. The LWIAs that receive more than 100 percent of their average DW percentage share from the prior two years were proportionately reduced by an amount to total the funding necessary for those LWIAs that were below the 90 percent threshold.

Additionally, the DW allocation formula contains the following four weighted factors:

- Long -Term Unemployment Insurance (UI) Claims – weighted at 40 percent
- Mid -Term UI Claims – weighted at 30 percent
- Short –Term UI claims – weighted at 10 percent
- Long – Term Civilian Unemployment - weighted at 20 percent

The ARRA allotments to California and the amounts available for formula allocation to the LWIAs are as follows:

The term for all three allocations is from February 17, 2009, to June 30, 2010. Adult formula funds are subgranted under grant code 102; Youth formula funds are under grant code 103; and DW formula funds are under grant code 105. There also is a fourth grant code (107) only to be used to report participants for summer youth.

The attachment reflects the total amounts each LWIA will receive in ARRA formula funds for each of the funding streams during Program Year 2008-09.
