The Employment Development Department (EDD) promotes California's economic growth by providing services to keep employers, employees, and job seekers competitive. In addition to the services provided by EDD, below is a list of additional resources that may assist you. Some programs may have eligibility criteria.

Basic Necessities Assistance

- **California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs)**
Cash assistance to families with children and pregnant women in the last 120 days of pregnancy, who have little or no assets or income.
